Strange Gifts

Matthew 2:1-12 records the story of the wise men coming to worship the baby Jesus. Whenever I was young, I thought it was very strange that the wise men presented the infant with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. I thought these 'wise' men would have brought more practical gifts such as baby clothes, toys, blankets or even a cot; not gold, frankincense and myrrh. It was only much later in my Christian life that I began to realise both the wisdom and the significance of the gifts that the wise men brought to the Saviour as a young child.

They brought gold. In Bible times gold was the merchandise of kings. The wise men somehow knew that this child was a king, not just any king, but the King of kings. Gold also speaks of purity, worth and value. What a picture of the Lord Jesus. He was, and is, pure, spotless and without blemish. Consider His great value and worth. In particular, the Bible mentions the value, worth and preciousness of the Saviour's blood which was shed for sinners like us.

They brought Frankincense. Frankincense was a beautiful sweet-smelling

product. Its perfume would fill the air and linger for a very long time. It reminds us of the Saviour. The sweetness of His presence fills the air. Being with Him is the most pleasant experience imaginable. During His earthly ministry people thronged to be in His company and oftentimes they desired Him to tarry a while longer. Being in the presence of the Lord is the best company anyone could ever have. I wonder who you keep company with.

They also brought myrrh. In ancient times this very special perfume was used to anoint the dead. What a strange gift to bring to someone who was so young. However, this gift reminds us of something very important and that is the Lord Jesus came to lay down His life as a sacrifice for us so that we might be forgiven, cleansed and have the hope of eternal life in heaven some day.

The gifts that the wise men brought were not so strange after all but rather, they are reminders of who the Saviour was and what He came to do for you and me.
